## SCHOOL INFO & REMINDERS

### Kindergarten Registration

Please note Kindergarten Registration for Ladner Elementary School will take place on **Wednesday, February 13<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 9:00 am to 11:30 am.** The following documents **must be provided when registering** and required before the student can start at school:



1. Child's Birth Certificate (**registration will not be accepted until proof of birth is received**)
2. Proof of residency (municipal bill or copy of purchase/rental agreement. **We cannot accept hydro, telephone, etc. or driver's license.**)
3. Proof of citizenship for both the parent and the student (Canadian birth certificate, citizenship card, passport, landed immigrant document, permanent resident card)
4. Immunization record, care card, medical and emergency contact information.

This year the Ministry is being extremely strict about registering students without the proper documentation. Although we can hold the registration, we cannot accept it until a copy of the birth certificate is provided. Please ensure that you bring the original birth certificate and all proper documentation to the registration on February 13<sup>th</sup>.

## Announcements of District-wide Closures and/or Delayed Openings of Schools



As winter weather has arrived, we want to remind parents/guardians, students, and staff of the Delta School District's winter weather procedures and announcements.

All schools in the Delta School District will remain **OPEN** if at all possible during winter weather, including snowfalls. Any district-wide closure will be decided by 7:00 a.m. at the latest and will be announced through the media as well as through the District and school websites. Please note that no announcement will be made stating that schools are open. Only closures and delayed openings will be announced.

Information about any district-wide closures will be sent to Metro Vancouver radio and television stations. Please check the following stations for school closure information:

Announcements of school closures or delayed openings will be posted on the School District's website. Individual school closures due to unique circumstances (e.g., power outages) will be announced as early as possible on the District website as well as on the affected schools' websites. On occasion, schools may delay the start of the school day; if this happens, specific details will be posted on the school and District websites.

Student safety is the first priority of the Delta School District. Parents/Guardians are responsible for their children's safe travel to and from school. If, for any reason, a parent/guardian feels that a child cannot travel safely to school, then they should make other arrangements. Schools will be kept open except under extreme circumstances to provide the option of attendance for all, but the decision to attend is the responsibility of each family.

During extreme weather conditions it is also common for police and other authorities to advise citizens to avoid unnecessary travel. Parents should take this advice as well. Students will not be penalized for lack of attendance under such poor weather conditions. This is also a reminder to all students to dress warmly and wear appropriate clothing. Sidewalks and roads can be extremely slippery and so students walking to school are advised to take extra care.

At this time, we encourage you to review your own preparations for winter weather and ensure that you are familiar with your municipality's snow and ice response procedures. We request that you strictly adhere to parking restrictions in and around all Delta schools. Your child's school will contact you about any changes to driving routes that may be put into effect on streets adjacent to the school.

With your cooperation and adherence to winter weather procedures, we can help achieve safe conditions for students travelling to and from school. Please put safety first.

## Pick Up and Drop Off of Students



You may have noticed how busy traffic can be out the front of our school. We have several buses and vans that pick up groups of children afterschool and drop them off the next morning. We also have a drop off lane at the front of the school next to the gymnasium.

**The drop off lane is only for drop off (a quick exit of the vehicle) and pick up (students who are ready to enter the car). Please do not park and leave your car in this lane. The roundabout driveway in front of the office is NOT FOR STUDENT DROP OFF.** It is reserved for buses and daycare shuttles. Using this lane for student drop off creates additional traffic at our crosswalk, which increases the level of risk for our students and parents. We are also very lucky to have Cromie Park at the back of our school. There is a large parking lot and a footpath that leads directly to the school. Please consider using Cromie Park as your drop off and pick up point. Also, when leaving the drop off lane please yield to pedestrians as the exit the staff parking lot.

Our upper intermediate students mind the crosswalk out front of the school. They are trained by our Police Liaison Officer and do a wonderful job of controlling traffic in the crosswalk. If you use this crosswalk with your children it would be wonderful if you could give these hard working students a quick Thank You! Please follow their instructions and respect their role in the crosswalk to ensure everyone's safety.

## Handwashing to Prevent the Spread of Germs

*Germs are invisible and they are just about everywhere. When you touch a doorknob, pick up a book, or pet a dog your hands pick up germs. Handwashing prevents the spread of germs. Why not take a few minutes and review these steps with you family?*

- ✓ Wet your hands under running water.
- ✓ Scrub with soap for a count of 30. Make sure you work up some suds.
- ✓ Rinse under running water for a count of 5.
- ✓ Dry with a clean towel.

**All family members should wash their hands:**

- ✓ After using the washroom.
- ✓ After petting an animal.
- ✓ Before eating.

# Snowboarding

According to the BC Injury Prevention Centre, a recent study from Vancouver Hospital & Health Sciences Centre shows that snowboarders are **four** times more likely to hurt their spinal cords than skiers are. Many of these very serious injuries occur during jumps of more than 2 meters.



**How do I help my child to be injury-free?**

**Four steps to be injury-free:**

- ◆ **Get training.** Pre-season exercise gets you in shape. Learn basic manoeuvres from an instructor so that you stay in control.
- ◆ **Know your Abilities and Experience.** Ski and snowboard with a friend. Always stay in sight of each other in case of an emergency.
- ◆ **Know your Physical Environment.** Be aware. Know snow conditions.
- ◆ **Know your attitude.** A positive mental attitude will help you look for hazards, stay in-bounds and choose the best run.
